Fair Allocation in Runways Accomplishments

- 1,600 members strong and growing in both city and suburbs – we are the first organization to successfully organize across the geographical “divide”
- FAiR Letter of Support signed by 26 civic organizations and 21 elected officials
- Leading voice for residents at both O’Hare and Midway airports
- Developed citizen-built 1-click noise reporting app
- Secured 8 additional noise monitors for both city and suburbs
- A strong and stable 17 person leadership team
- The trusted source of information about the airports by residents, media, elected officials and national organizations that turn to us to find out what’s going on
- Lead the push for sorely needed new leadership at the CDA and the ONCC
- Made solving the “O’Hare problem” a major election issue in both city and suburban races, at both the local and state level
- Part of an emerging national network of citizens and civics working together to find solutions
- Provides hope to many citizens who have seen their quality of life dramatically decreased due airplanes and who would otherwise not be heard over the roar of the plane traffic
